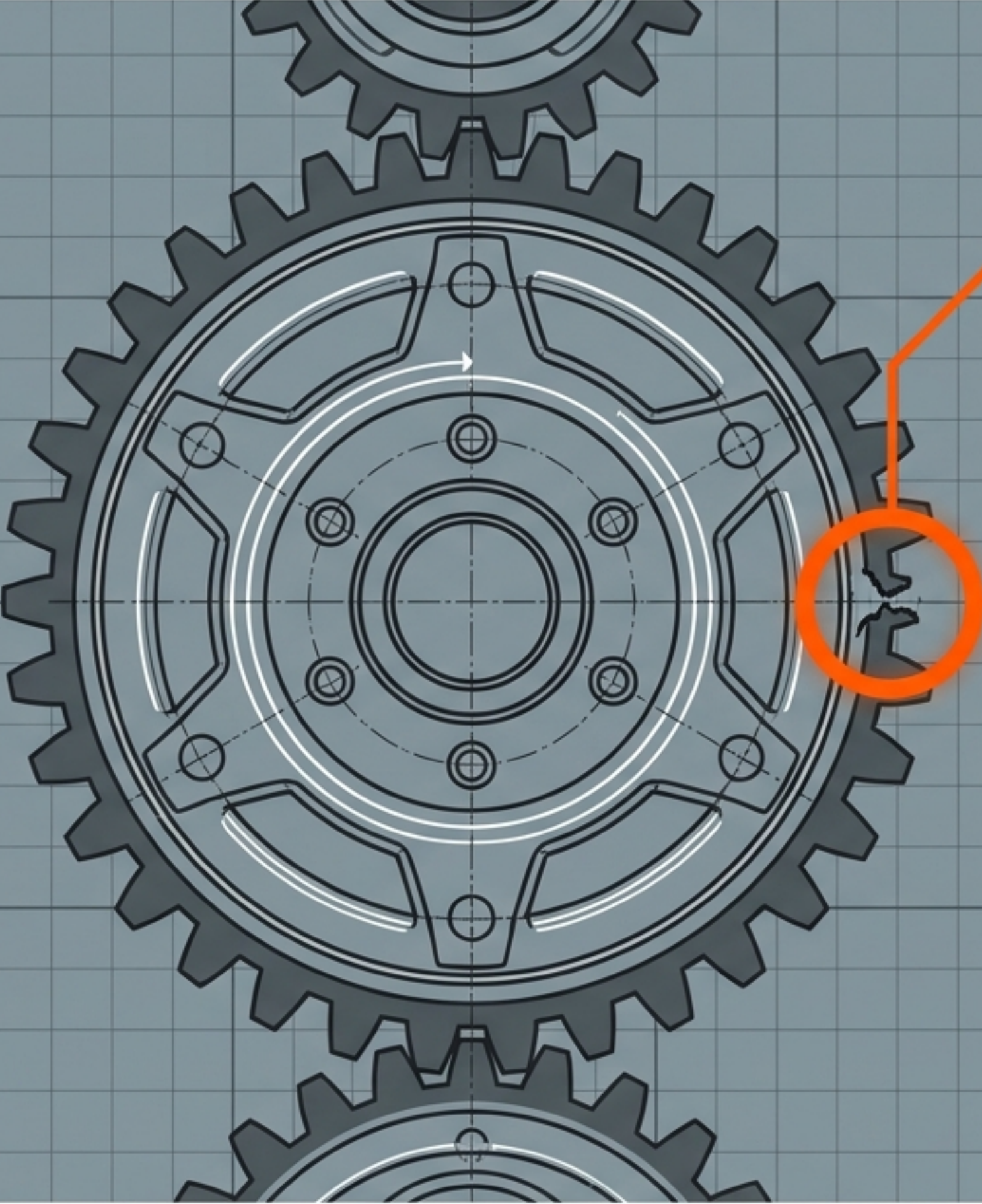

Keeping ourselves comfortable so we don't have to deal with their unhappiness.

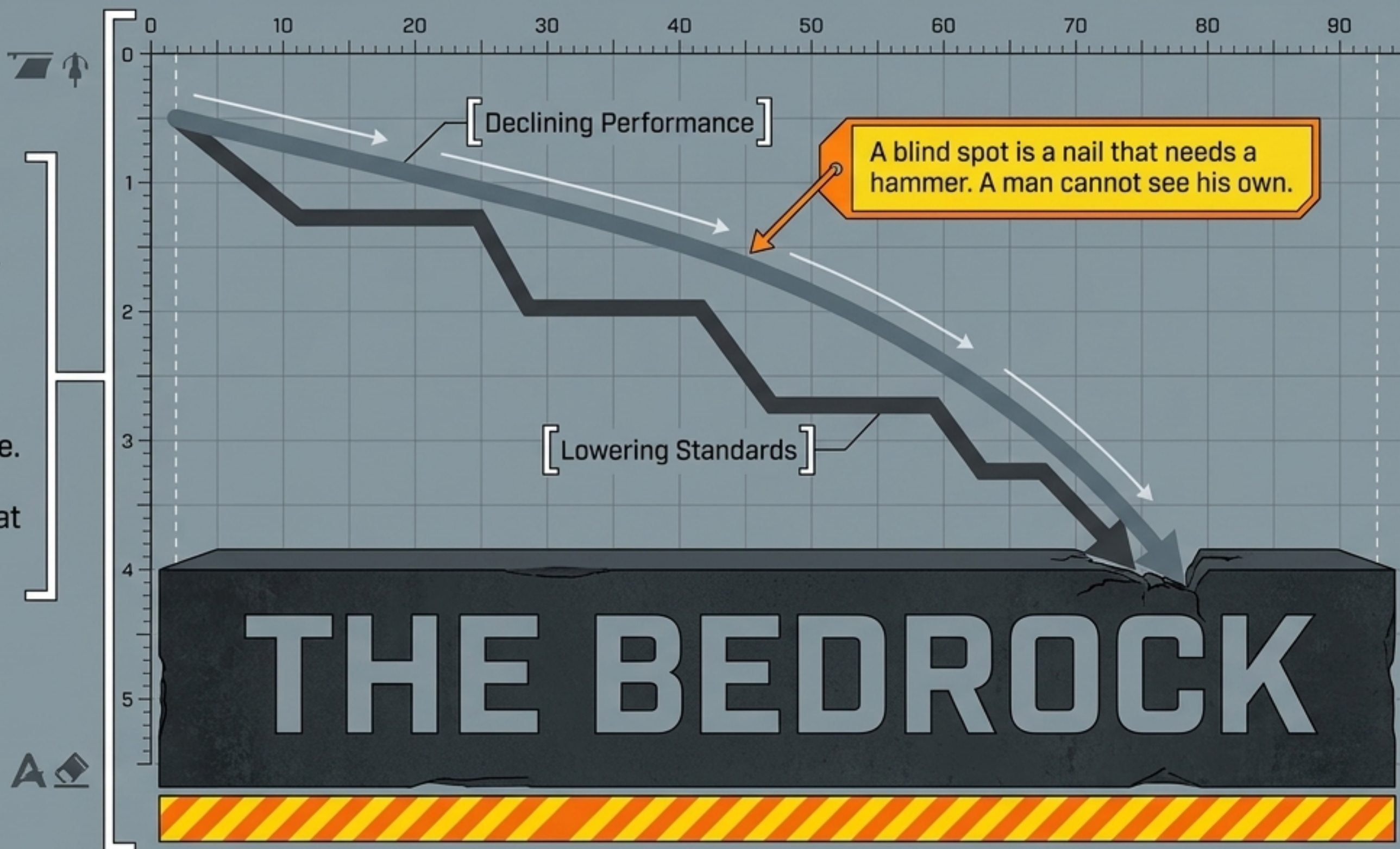

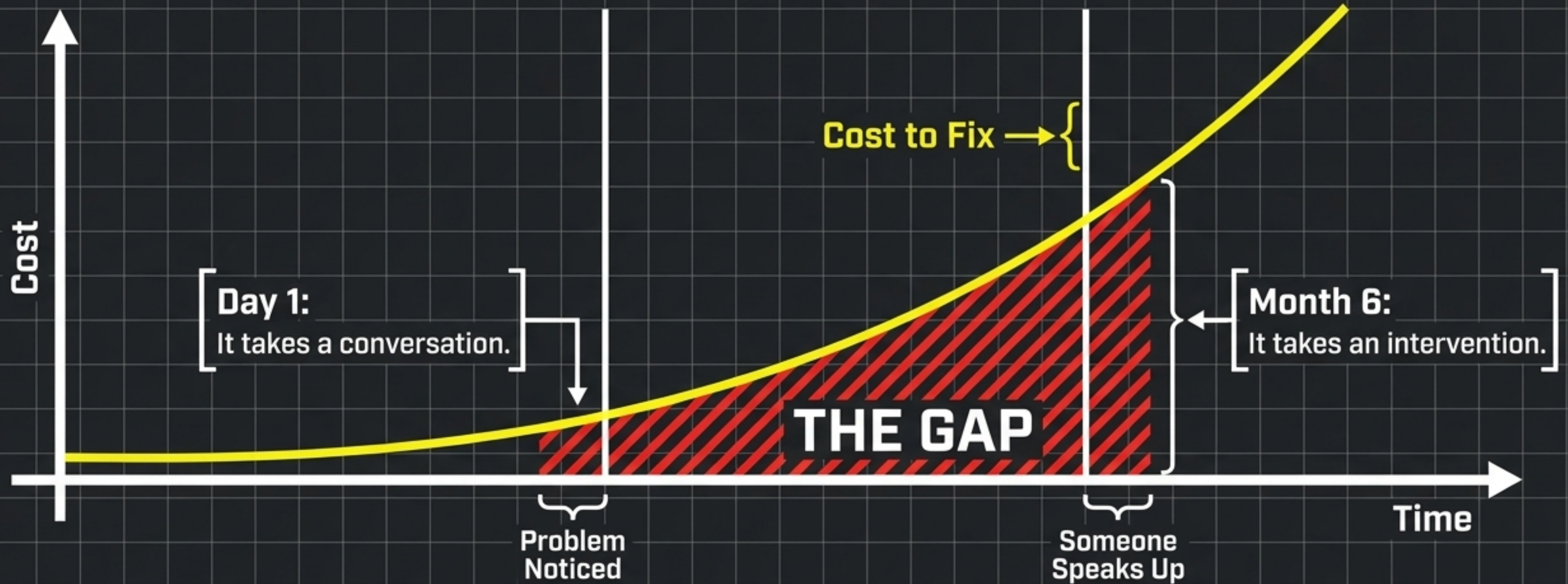
The anatomy of a free-fall.

The compounding cost of delay.



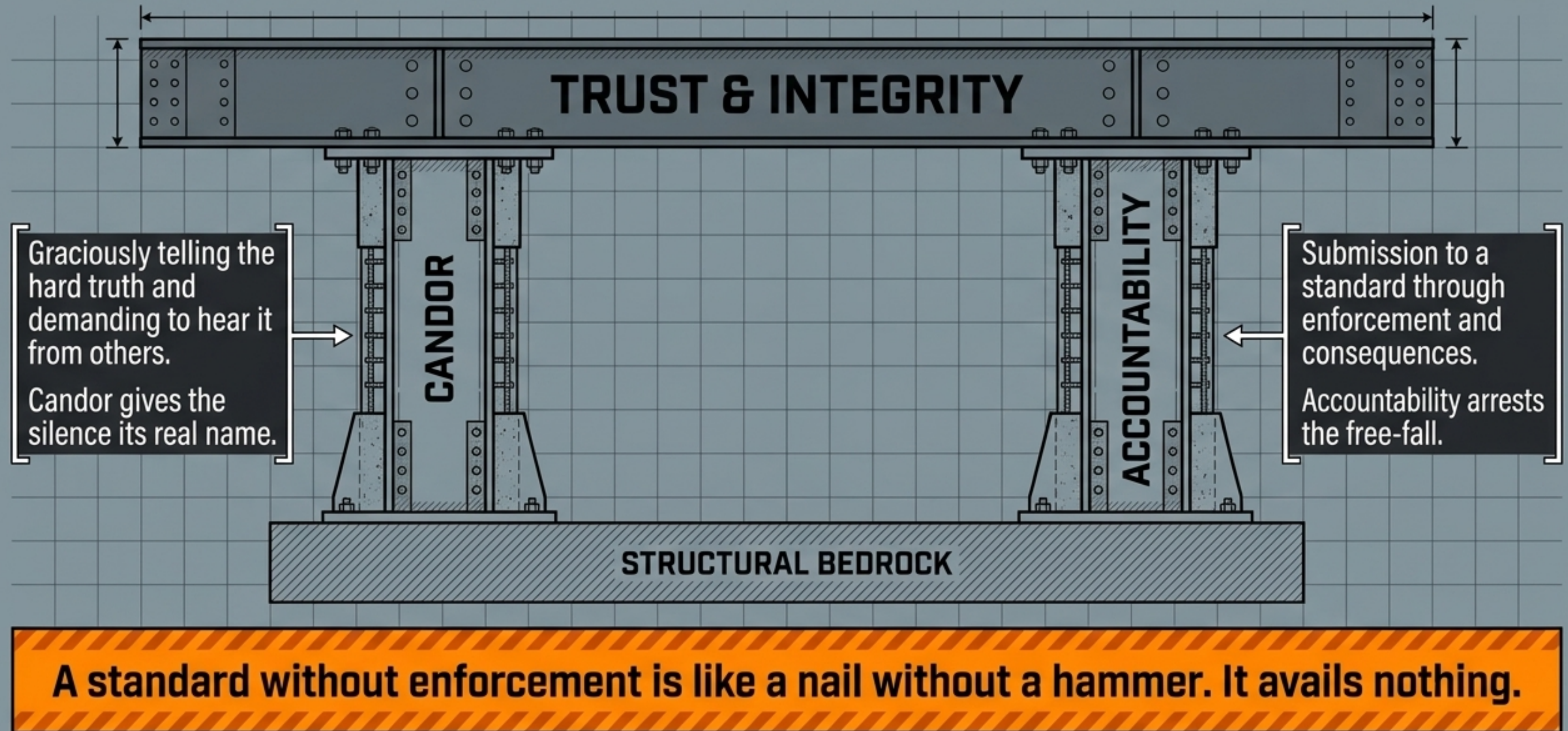
The gap between when you first notice a problem and when someone finally speaks up is where the damage happens.

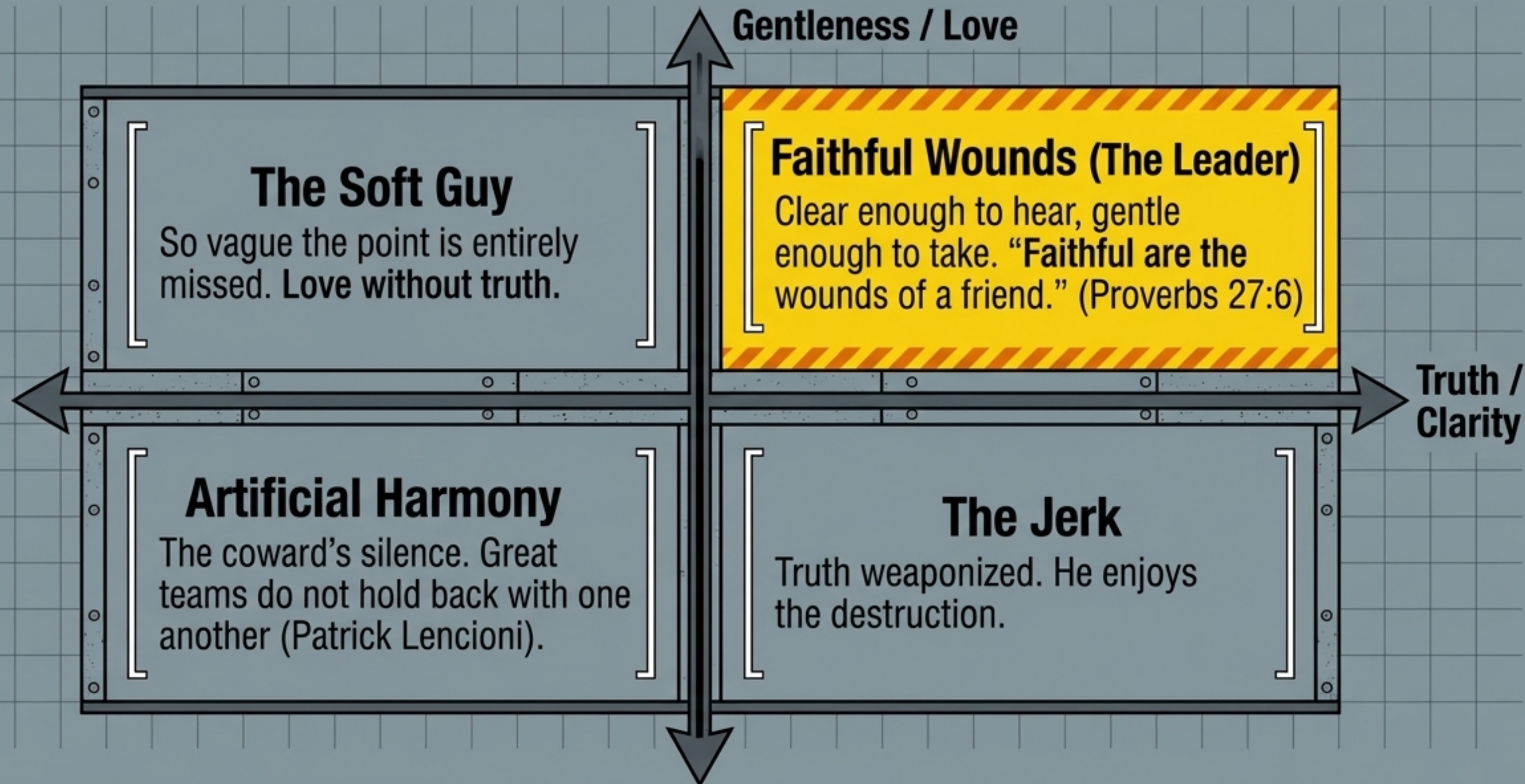
The four structural traps of evasion.

	Somebody Else's Silence	[Blaming the boss, the company, or the culture while ignoring your own complicity in the room.]
	The Hero Story	[Focusing entirely on the one time you DID speak up to avoid admitting the ten times you didn't.]
	The Safe Story	[Offering a low-stakes conflict (like an overcooked steak) to avoid actual vulnerability.]
	The Personality Excuse	[Claiming "I'm just not confrontational." That describes the structural defect; it does not excuse it.]

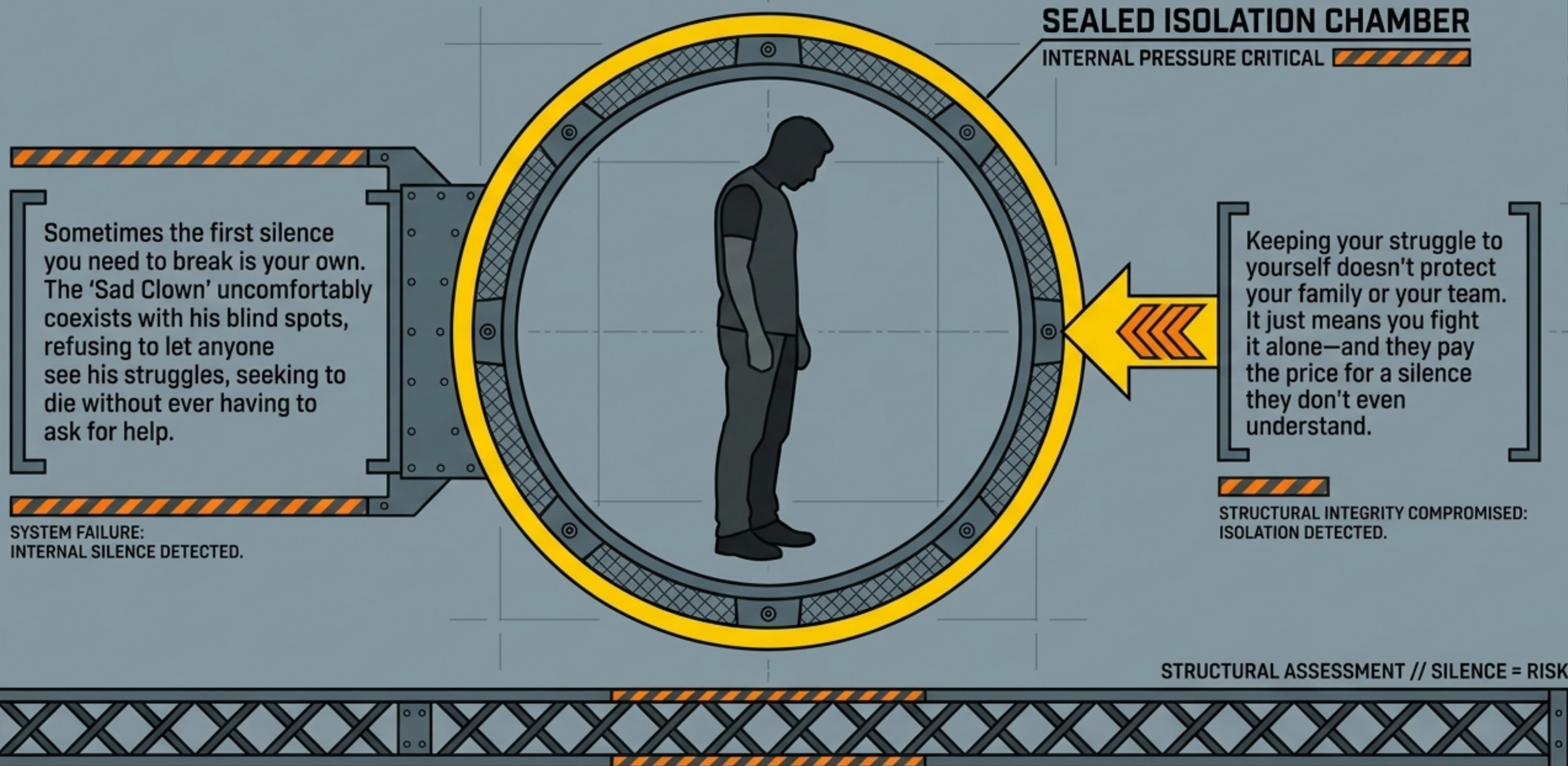
The twin pillars of structural defense.

The Sad Clown Paradox.



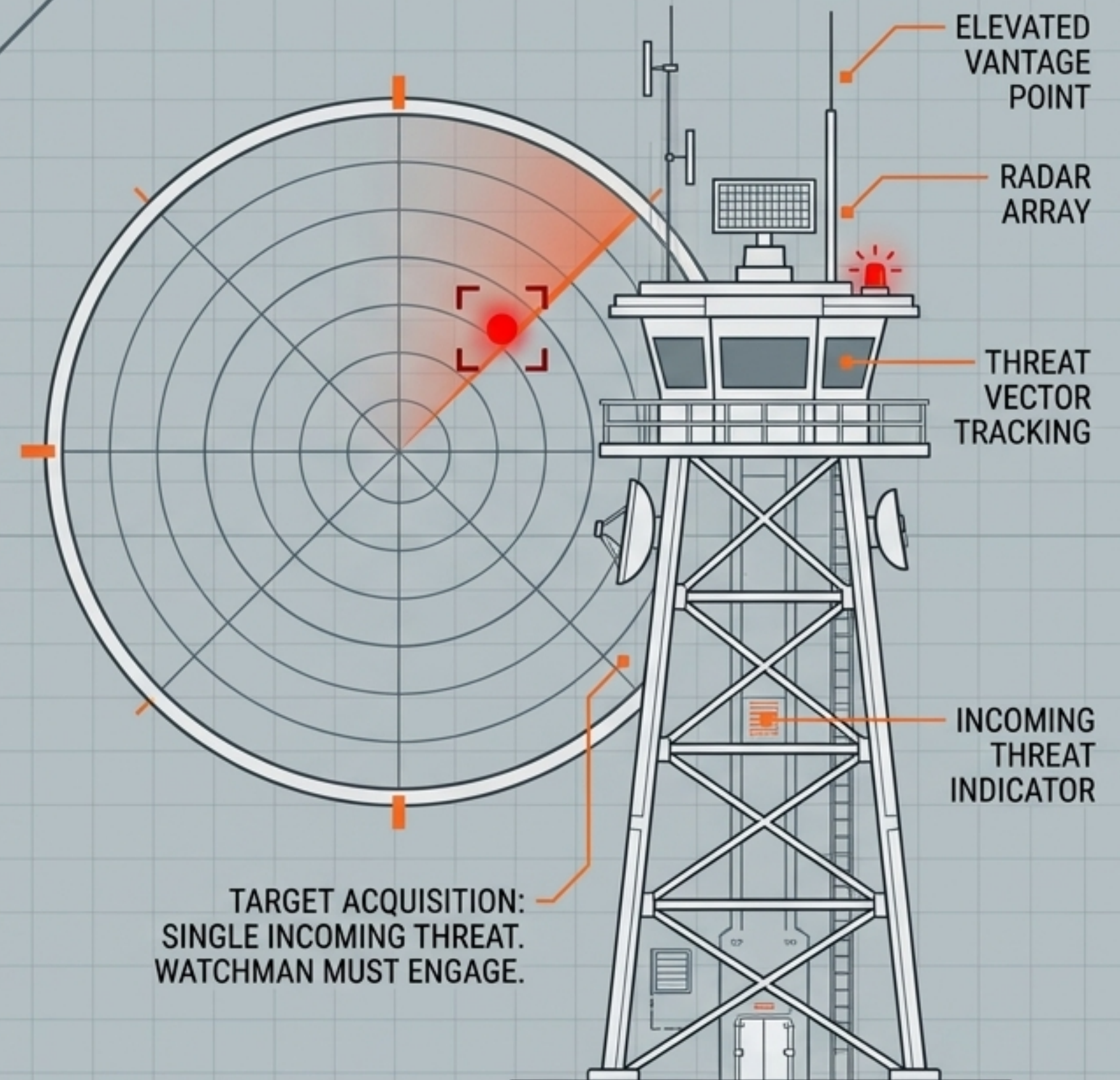
The Watchman's Burden

HISTORICAL FAILURE DATA

God doesn't need your voice, but He put you in the role where your voice matters most. Leading means you don't get to stay quiet just because it's easier for you.



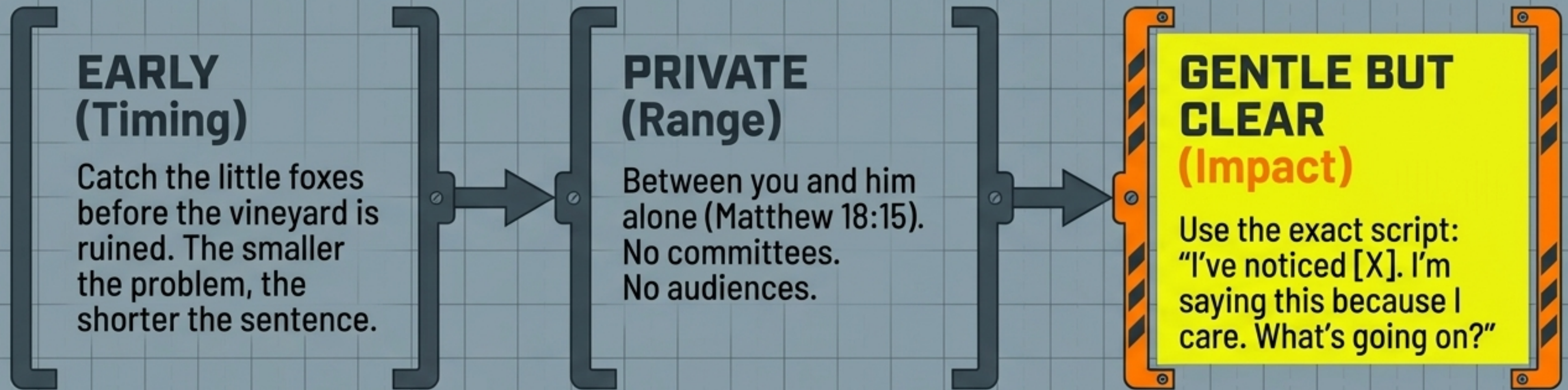
The mechanics of preemptive confession.

The tactical intervention playbook.



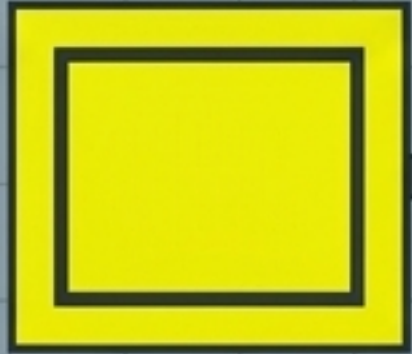
If you bring up a problem, you’ve signed up to help carry it. Don’t drop a hard truth and walk away.

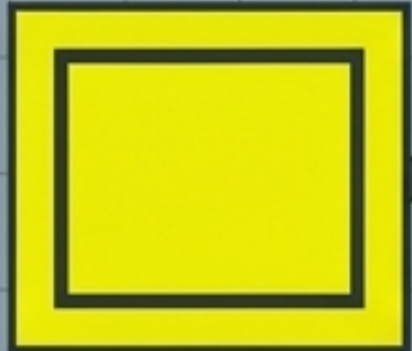

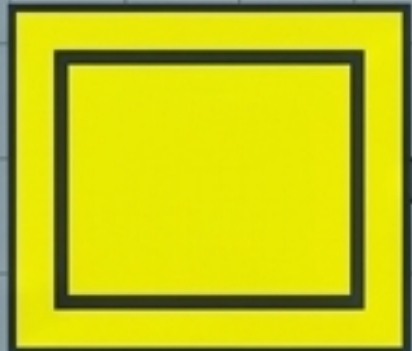
One Conversation

One Permission

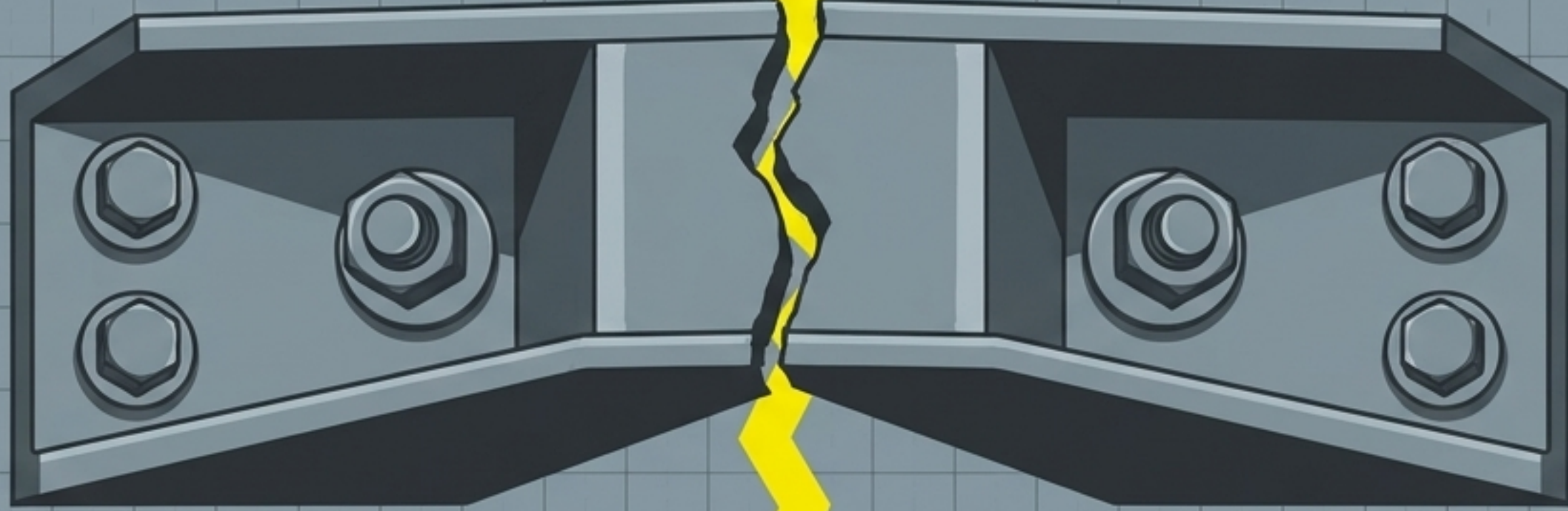
Name one man who has out-loud permission to speak
